HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

- The real Macbeth Held the throne in Scotland from 1040-1057. He was a good and wise ruler. He defeated the previous king, Duncan in Battle. Malcolm, Duncan's son, defeated and killed Macbeth, then slaughtered his whole family so that he could ensure his kingship would not be threatened.
