Character	Identity
Atticus Finch	A lawyer in a small town who defends a black man
Jean Louise "Scout" Finch	Atticus's young daughter who functions as the narrator of the story
Jeremy Atticus "Jem" Finch	The narrator's older brother
Calpurnia	The black cook who has been responsible for raising the Finch children.
Aunt Alexandra	The very proper aunt who comes to care for the children during the trial
Uncle Jack Finch	The bachelor uncle who comes to visit every Christmas
Charles Baker "Dill" Harris	Scout's companion who lives in Mississippi, but comes every summer to Maycomb
Miss Rachel Haverford	Scout's companion's aunt who lives next door to the Finches
Miss Maudie Atkinson	Neighbor of the Finches who is very open-minded and often has discussions with the children
Mrs. Henry Lafayette Dubose	The old lady down the street who screams at the children as they pass her house
Arthur "Boo" Radley	The mysterious neighbor whom the children have never seen

Nathan Radley	The stern, distant brother of the mysterious neighbor who seldom speaks
Heck Tate	The sheriff, who is also a good friend to the Finches
Tom Robinson	A hard working, young black man who is accused of a crime against a poor, white trash woman
Judge John Taylor	The presiding judge at the trial of the accused
Bob Ewell	The irresponsible, disgraceful father of a brood of children who receives welfare checks and spends them on alcohol
Mayella Ewell	White trash young woman who accuses a poor black man of rape
Mr. Walter Cunningham	An upright farmer who refuses to accept charity
Reverend Sykes	The black minister who takes care of the children during the trial
Miss Stephanie Crawford	A gossipy neighbor who knows the family histories of the entire neighborhood
Mr. Dolphus Raymond	A white man who prefers to live with black people. Owner of the town newspaper
