Types of Conflict

MAN VS. MAN

- involves a struggle with another character
 - protagonist vs. antagonist; good guy vs. bad guy

Ex: Batman vs. Joker

EXTERNAL

MAN vs. SOCIETY

 struggle against social traditions, culture, expectations, or rules in the society in which a person lives

Ex: In To Kill a Mockingbird, Atticus Finch encounters problems when he decides to defend a black man against a white woman.

EXTERNAL

MAN vs. NATURE

- involves a struggle with a force of nature
 - o natural disaster
 - o animal
 - o desolation
- usually for survival

Ex: In "To Build a Fire," the man must face the extreme cold.

EXTERNAL

MAN vs. SELF

- struggle within a character's mind
- usually involves a choice (like right or wrong) or the fight to overcome emotions or mixed feelings

Ex: In Romeo and Juliet, Juliet struggles with her feelings and her decision to love Romeo.
